



how to buy a travel system

A travel system is a stroller plus an infant car seat and base, sold as a package. The fabric matches, and the car seat snaps into the stroller.

Be sure the car seat fits in your car and the stroller suits your needs. Or create your own travel system by choosing separate but compatible components.

what to look for when buying

Handle height: Stroller handles should be at your waist or slightly below. Adjustable handles are helpful for parents of different heights.

Safety standards: Look for Juvenile Products Manufacturers Association (JPMA) certification on the stroller or packaging.

Canopy: An adjustable shade protects your child from sun, rain, and wind.

Adjustable seat: Some models let you change the seat position from facing you to facing out.

Safety harnesses: Your baby needs a five-point harness in the car seat and stroller.

Easy to clean: A removable fabric cover makes cleanup easier.

Stability: Make sure that the stroller frame locks into position and the car seat attaches securely.

Brakes: They should be easy to use. Wheels should lock when brakes are engaged.

Extras: Helpful features include cup holders, covers for extra warmth, and an organizer pocket or tray.

what to avoid

Strollers you can't handle: Ask before buying – Will the stroller fit in your car? Can you fold and lift it up stairs or into a car?

Pain-inducing parts: Look out for sharp edges or protrusions. Fingers and toes can get caught in metal parts or pinched by exposed springs.
